# **INFORMED: Protecting Our Tree Canopy**

## **Trees & Chipping: Think Before You Cut**

With Spring Fever in the air, and the City's chipping program underway, it is hard not to get a little overzealous with adding wood to the chipping piles. However, make sure you 'Think Before You Cut!'

Although it is fine to trim back shrubs and hedges in your yard, be careful when it comes to cutting your trees. Keep the following in mind;

**Location:** The tree that stands within three metres of the front curb is most likely on City land; and if it is designated as a street tree, it's not to be trimmed or cut by anyone but the City Arborist. Cutting, and especially topping, a City street

tree may damage it beyond repair. If that happens you may be responsible for the cost of replacement. Call the Parks & Facilities office at 604-467-7346 to place a request for the City to prune the street tree in front of your house, if you think it needs it.

The Right Tree for The Right Place: Topping is when branches or the entire top of a tree is indiscriminately cut off in an attempt to control the height of a tree. A tree's height

Tree Health: For trees to remain healthy and in good form,

proper pruning cuts are necessary. Have a qualified Arborist

or Horticulture Technician prune trees that are important to

A tree's height is determined by its genes, and topping a tree that wants to be tall will only result in a constant maintenance nightmare, a structurally weak tree and a future hazard. Talk to an expert before topping a tree.

# **INFORMED: Emergency**

## **Alert Ready Notification System**

Last Friday a national mobile phone alert system went live across Canada. The system is called 'Alert Ready' and in the event of an emergency your phone will automatically get an emergency signal to allow you to get more information regarding emergency notifications. The system works on your 'wireless public alerting' device on an LTE network.

There are 30 different hazards that could trigger an alert, but Emergency Management BC (EMBC) will only be using this service for Tsunami warnings to begin and has plans to expand the program to include other hazards.
