240 Street and McClure Avenue Pedestrian-Controlled Traffic Signal

In 2018, the City completed a pedestrian crossing warrant analysis for the intersection of 240 Street and McClure Avenue, resulting in the recommendation that a pedestrian-controlled traffic signal be installed at the intersection. This project was subsequently included in the 2019 Financial Plan.

The work generally consists of installation of a traffic signal, pavement restoration and markings, and intersection lighting.

Construction is currently underway and is anticipated to be completed in late February, weather permitting. Single lane traffic may be required at times and we thank you in advance for your patience during the construction period.

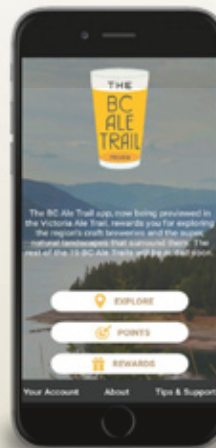


THERE'S AN APP FOR ALE-VENTURING!

The BC Ale Trail rolled out a new mobile app in 2019 for craft beer enthusiasts interested in exploring breweries, tap houses and surrounding points of interest (e.g. outdoor adventure, restaurants, farmer's markets and more). The Maple Ridge Ale Trail is one of 18 BC ale trails featured on the app, a marketing tool that encourages people to visit our four local craft breweries and four tap houses. The two newest Maple Ridge Ale Trail 2020 locations include the ever-popular Billy Miner Ale House and Witchcraft Beer Market and Bistro. Users of the mobile app can explore the locations on the Ale Trail, check-in and collect points upon arrival into participating breweries, ancillary businesses and the Maple Ridge Visitor Centre. Once they have accumulated enough points, users can redeem them for a reward at participating locations.

The mobile platform collects valuable user data to measure economic impact and other valuable metrics for stakeholders. Other BC Ale Trail analytics from the Ale Trail website, social media and digital advertising also measure the reach and benefits of the Destination BC marketing partnership program. For example in 2019, the BC Ale Trail website had 742,000 unique page views and attracted 10,000 Instagram followers. These views and sessions indicate the reach on social media extends to countries world-wide and shows interest from Australia, Germany, Peru, the UK and other countries.

The mobile app, managed by the BC Craft Brewers Guild, is one of many tools that are provided to the City



of Maple Ridge tourism office to market Maple Ridge as a destination of choice and to promote an increase in visitor and resident visits and local spending. Other marketing tactics available through the program include video production, blog content, social media management, consumer show engagement and traditional advertising. This Spring a new addition to the marketing campaign will be a Regional Print Map to highlight the Maple Ridge Ale Trail and the café's, restaurants, hotels and other ancillary businesses included in the program. This

brochure will be distributed to airports, BC Ferries and visitor information display racks located in high-traction locations throughout the Western United States and Western Canada.

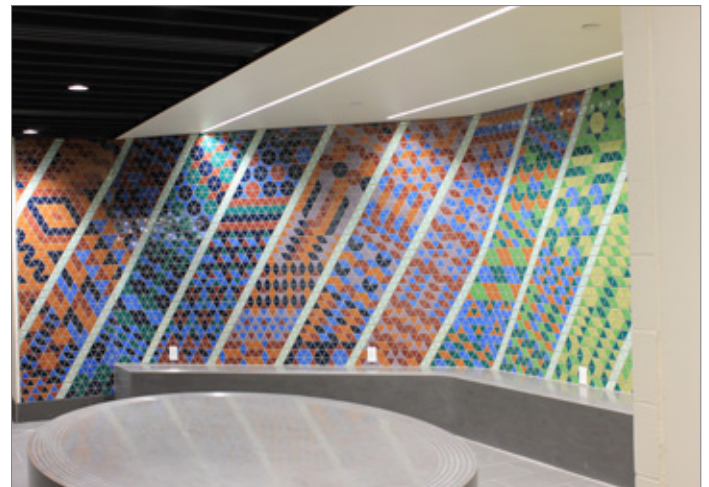

Maple Ridge Community Mosaic

As part of the Leisure Centre renovation project, the "Maple Ridge Community Mosaic" will officially be unveiled at the upcoming grand reopening on February 23, 2020.
