Emergency Operations Centre/Emergency Support Services

Laurie Darcus, Manager of Legislative Services & Emergency Program introduced Patrick Cullen, Emergency Program Coordinator to Council.

Patrick Cullen made a presentation to Council regarding the Emergency Operations Centre and Emergency Support Service and how it relates to Council.

Mr. Cullen provided information to Council on their roles and responsibilities during an emergency situation.

Plebiscite Details for Provision of Road-Side Waste Pick-up (Garbage and Organics)

Laurie Darcus, Manager of Legislative Services & Emergency Program provided Council with details regarding a plebiscite and noted that a plebiscite is an opinion poll and that Council can make the following two decisions:

1. When it will happen.
2. Who will be allowed to participate in the voting.

Ms. Darcus reviewed the steps involved in holding a plebiscite. Council directed staff to conduct a plebiscite at the same time as the 2018 election and that anyone on the electors list for Maple Ridge may participate in the plebiscite.
