Annual Watermain Cleaning

Routine Flushing Areas:

- 240 Street working east to 252 Street between 100 Avenue and Dewdney Trunk Road
- 252 Street working east to 264 Street between 112 Avenue and Dewdney Trunk Road
- 252 Street working east to Garibaldi Street between Dewdney Trunk Road and 142 Avenue

This maintenance work will improve water quality; however, during this cleaning process some residents could experience water pressure drops and milky or dirty water. Please take the following steps to correct the problem:

- MILKY WATER: Open tap slightly to bleed air from the water lines.
- DIRTY WATER: Turn an outside tap on until the water becomes clear.

136 Avenue and Foreman Drive Development Servicing Works

The intersection of 136 Avenue and Forman Drive at the entrance to the Blaney Hamlet area in Silver Valley is undergoing construction as a part of the servicing works required for a 110 lot single family residential subdivision. This subdivision is known as the Birdtail Development and will be constructed in 4 Phases.

The Phase 1 works currently under construction include the construction of a storm sewer along the pedestrian pathway up Foreman Drive, re-profiling of Foreman Drive, a new road connection from the intersection of 136 Avenue and Foreman Drive up to 136 Avenue in Silver Valley, as well as storm, sanitary and watermain servicing within the development.

Residents can expect some minor traffic delays throughout the construction period as well as a planned two week full road closure on 136 Avenue and Foreman Drive beginning October 16 through October 30.
