

Installation of Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons at two crosswalks on 228 Street



As the City continues to improve pedestrian safety throughout the community, a pedestrian crossing facility analysis was performed on 228 Street, between Lougheed Highway and Dewdney Trunk Road. The study recommended that Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) be installed on 228 Street at Selkirk Avenue and 119 Avenue. RRFB's are user-activated flashing lights that supplement warning signs to warn drivers when pedestrians are using the crosswalk.

The City has previously installed RRFB's along the Dewdney Trunk Road Corridor as well as on Lougheed Highway at Burnett Street. These traffic control devices have been successful in enhancing pedestrian safety. Installation of the RRFB's will commence mid-November and construction is anticipated to be completed over 12 weeks, weather permitting.



Parks, Recreation and Culture

Festival Grant Program Deadline November 30

Maple Ridge Parks, Recreation & Culture supports special event activities through the City's Community Festival Grant Program. This grant program benefits the citizens of our community by fostering community spirit, encouraging active involvement and providing opportunities for social, economic and cultural development. Organizations eligible for support include local community festival groups and registered non-profit societies. The current intake is for festivals taking place May 1 to Oct 31, 2020 is by November 30, 2019 at 4pm. Grassroots Grant Applications for small and emerging festivals (up to 300 attendance) accepted year round are also available on the City's website.



Help Us Improve Access to Child Care

The City received a \$25,000 grant to create a Child Care Action Plan from the provincial Community Child Care Planning Program, through the Union of BC Municipalities. Development of the plan is currently in the information gathering stage.
