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Minutes of March Ist, 1947

The regular meeting of the Maple Ridge Council was held in the Municipal Hald, Haney B. C. on Saturday, March 1st, 1947 at 9:30 a.m. Present the Reeve and full Gouncil.

Moved by Coun. Bell and Lahti: That the minutes of Feb. 1st, 8th, 15th & 22nd and of the Court of Revision of Feb. 8th 1947 be adopted. CARRIED

> Mr. George Steeves of the Park Board presented the 1947 estimates amounting to \$1631.00. These were acknowledged received and to be given consideration when the estimates were brought down.

Mr. St. Jean spoke to the Council regarding the opening of 18th Ave. It was decided that the whole Council would review this work in the afternoon.

Mr. Harry Cutler was present and the question of laying the new water mains was discussed and it was finally decided to put Mr. Cutler in charge of all supplies of the whole system and specifically in charge of the Hammond water system and the laying of the new mains for the Municipal System.

Moved by Coun.Brown and Finnie: That Mr. Cutler be appointed Waterworks Superintendent in charge of Hammond System, all laying of new mains and stock room at \$150.00 per month.

CARRIED

Mr. Lerbeck offered \$2.50 per cond stumpage on the down cedar in the SW_4^1 of Nw_4^1 Sec.18, Tp.15. This was agreed to by the following motion:

Moved by Coun. Brown and Bell: That Mr. Lerbeck's offer of \$2.50 per cord stumpage on shingle bolts off SW1 of NW1 of Sec.18, Tp.15 be accepted. Time expires on Dec. 31st, 1947;

CARRIED

The question of storage of water pipes was gone into and the Clerk was to contact the Custodian in regard to the old Japanese hall on the corner of 2nd Ave and Powerline Road.

Mr. Miller again presented a petition signed by himself and three others for the surveying of the Gilker Road. The Council decided that they would look this matter over in the afternoon.

Mr. Percy Ward, Inspector of Hospitals was present. The Reeve asking his advice as how it could be handled and requested the following information: First advisability, Second - size, Third- Cost, and Fourth- Government Contribution. Mr. Ward stated that is was advisable to have a hospital if it could be handled financially. Question of size - He stated that for efficiency a minimum of 50 beds would be required. Cost- Approximately \$5000.00 per bed. This did not include equipment. Equipment for a hospital this size would run between \$25,000 and \$50,000 or more. Government Contribution- There was nothing definite in this regard but that normally if the hospital or proposed hospital received the approval of the Provincial secretary, they had in the past contributed one third of the cost of construction. Mr. Ward stated that there were only two Municipally owned hospitals and recommended that a hospital should be handled by a purely Voluntary organization financing isself through contributing a foar share of finace for construction

and a separately registered society to pperate it. He was of the opinion that if a voluntary group were to obtain subscriptions for say one third, the Council to pass a bylaw contributing one third and the government contributing one third would be to his mind very satisfactory.

It would appear from his remarks that Mr. Ward did not favour altogether a hospital financed completely by a Municipal bond issue. Mr. Ward was also questioned as to the turning away of patients by a hospital. His reply was that genuine cases requiring hospitalization would not be turned away.

Moved by Councillor Brown and Seconded by Councillor Langley: "That a vote of thanks be extended to Mr. Ward for his attendance and his advise.

CARRIED

It was decided that a special meeting of the Council would be held on Wednsesay, March 5th, 1947 at 7 p.m. at which time the committee of the Board of Trade on hospitals would be asked to attend and that the waterworks engineer be asked to attend at 8 p.m.

Councillor Brown reported on his interview with Mr. Betts on the flooding of 32nd road. Moved by Coun. Brown and Finnie: That Mr. Betts be informed that 32nd

A letter from the B.C. Electric Rlway Co. in regard to the pole line to Mr. NM.McKay's place at Whonock was read and filed, copy to be sent to Mr. McKay.

A letter from T. Hollinshead suggesting certain work to be done at the Whonock cemetery and for consideration of a n increase in pay was read and it was agreed by the Council that if Mr. Hollinshead had this extra work he would receive a bonus of \$5.00.

Major Jones of the Salvation Army was present requesting a yearly donation. He was informed that this would be taken care of in the estimates.

Applications for the position of outsident Collector were read from Percy B. Russell and Edward D. Airth of Hammond and the Reeve suggested that the add be run again.

The Clerk bought up the question of placing a water main to serve the King and Griffiths subdivisions. It was agreed by the Council that a 3 inch main be installed.

The question of a sewer connection to the proposed milk plant of Trerise Bros. in the lane back of the Theatre was discussed and the following motion passed.

Moved by Counc. Brown and Finnie: That Trerise be charged the cost of installing sewer to the road and also \$50.00 toward capital cost of sewer.

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A special meeting of the Maple Ridge Council was held in the Municipal Hall, Haney, B. C. on Wednesday, March 5th, 1947 at 7 p.m. Present the Reeve and Councillors Langley, Finnie, Brown and Bell.

A committee of some 24 persons headed by Mr. Alexander were present at the request of the Council and a discussion of hospital requirements took place. It was finally decided that the Clerk should write Mr. Ward asking him to set a suitable date to meet with the Council and the Hospital Committee. The Clerk to notify all parties concerned on hearing from Mr. Ward.

Mr. Henri and some 12 other business men in the district north of Lougheed Highway on 8th Ave, were present and akded that the Council replace the present black-top sidewalk on 8th Avenue with concrete. They also suggested that 8th Avenue should be cleared, graded and gravelled on both sides of the property lines providing extra space for parking purposes. They also asked the Council to consider placing a concrete sidewalk between 8th and 9th Ave's and the filling of the ditch on the South side of the Dewdney Trunk Road between these avenues if it was possible. These matters were left for consideration by the Council.

Mr. Roger Harris, representing the Volunteer Fire Brigade asked the Council to state someting definite in regard to their appropriations. This was done by the following motion:

Moved by Coun. Brown and Finnie: That \$1200 be granted to Maple Ridge Volunteer Fire Dept. for 1947.

CARRIED

Mr. Harris also outlined the proposed new fire hall and requested the Council for permission to build it on the Civic Centre site immediately North of the Roman Catholic Church property. This the Council was going to consider after visiting the site and looking the proposition over.

Messrs Powell and Gilbert of the Greater Vancouver Water Board and Messrs McGugan and Cutler were present for a discussion of the new water line. The Council agreed that provision for fire hydrants should be left on the mains of the Greater Vancouver Water Board line at about approximately 800 feet apart. Mr. Powell estimated each connection on their steel pipe line including the valve would cost approximately \$75.00. It was also donsidered advisable by the Council that tees should be left for the purposes of installing fire hydrants on the new municipal water mains. This to be left to the discretion of Mr. McGugan and Mr. Cutler.According to Mr. McGugan the installation of the nipples by the Greater Vancouver Water Board for fire hydrant service and the immediate cost would only be between \$20.00 and \$25.00 Valves were not required until hydrants were installed.

Mr. McGugan spoke on the Haney Sewer Extension No. 2 scheme and **EMETPuctions were given** by the Council that the Bylaw be set for \$50,000, 30 year, **35** serial issue. The final details to be worked out by the Engineer and the Municipal Clerk.

Councillor Langley reported that he had interviewed the B. C. Equipment Co and that a new hoist and winch with a Continental motor could be purchased for \$2960.00. As the Council was not prepared to do this at once the Clerk was to Write and ask the B.C. Equipment Co. to allow further time for consideration. A letter from the Veterans Land Board in connection with the exchange of Right of Ways in lot 4 of NW4 Sec.16, Tp.12 was read and the Clerk to advise that the Council was agreeable.

A letter from Tom Greaves giving notice of two weeks as termination of his services was read and was not accepted by the Council and he was offered an extra \$10.00 a month to stay on the job

Moved by Coun. Brown and Bell: That T.Greaves salary be increased to \$135.00 per month.

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Minutes of July 23rd. 1947.

A special meeting of the Maple Ridge Council was held in th e Municipal Hall, Haney, B.C. on Wednesday, July 23rd. 1947 at 7:30 p.m. Present Reeve S. Mussallem and Councillors Finnie, Brown, Bell & Langley.

Doctors Morse, Broe, Arber & Katz were present for a discussion in connection with a Medical Agreement between the Doctors and the Municipality for the care of all Social Assistance cases etc. and Mr. Endicott, Regional Supervisor of the S.A. Branch and his assistant Mr. Nivin were also present and outlimed to the Doctors and the Council the Government's proposition which was that the Government was willing to share in a Medical Agreement up to 50¢ per capita for each person on Social Assistance, Mother's Allowance or Old Age Pension to-gether with their dependents, in Maple Ridge the case load as of June 30th. 1947 was 292 this would mean \$146.00 per month to the Doctors. The Doctors would have to agree to give medical care and minor surgery to all those persons coming within the said category. In addition all necessary drugs and medicines would be paid for. The Doctors and the Council then discussed the whole subject and the Doctors were not willing to sign any such agreement but would be willing to give the required medical care if the Municipality would honour their monthly bills at regular fees. This was not acceptable to the Gouncil and Doctors retired without any further discussion.

Messrs. Endicott and Nivin were thanked for being present.

A letter from the M.R. Hospital Ass'n was read asking that the Council arrange for a meeting with the Hon. G.Pearson in connection with a hospital and that the Reeve be delegated to attend along with the hospital committee. Mr. Jackson was present supporting the request.

Moved by Coun. Brown and Bell That the Hospital Ass'n request be acceded to and that the Reeve go to Victoria with their executive after making an appointment for them. <u>CARRIED</u>

Mr. J. Wilson was present regarding his purchase of Lot 15 of SE1, Sec. 27, Twp. 12, which had a reservation of 60 feet for a road allowance. He asked that the road allowance be reduced to 33 feet.

Moved by Coun. Finnie & Brown: That the motion to sell Lot 15 of SE1, Sec. 27, twp. 12, reserving 60 feet along the Allouette River Bank as passed on March 14th. 1946 be amended to read reserving 33 ft. from the edge of the River Bank for a road allowance instead of 60 ft. <u>CARRIED</u>

Mr. Ivor Evans spoke to the Council regarding certain costs that he had been up against in clearing a large stump off of 30th. Road and requested that he would accept \$10.00.

Moved by Coun. Bell & Brown: That Mr. Ivor Evans be granted \$10.00 for clearing road allowance. <u>CARRIED</u>

Mr. E. Shoesmith spoke to the Council regarding his purchase of the timber on Lot 16 of the N.E., Sec. 28, Twp. 12 for the sum of \$90.00 in 1945. The Clerk turned up the minutes to show that he had been given a time limit of 1 year to remove same. This Lot was recently sold to the Nelson Bros. for #300.00. The Council decided that the only thing they could do about it was to refund him his money.

Id by Coun. Bell & Finnie: That Mr. Shoesmith be refunded the sum of \$90.00 on timber sold to him in 1945 which he did not remove in the time allowed. <u>CARRIED</u>

The Reeve reported; that the Volunteer Fire Dept. wanted two Councillors appointed who could attend their meetings and in this connection appointed Councillors A. Finnie and J.D. Brown.

A letter from Neuerts Service Station regarding the closing of service stations was read and the Clerk to reply that they could only go by the Bylaw.

A letter from the Can. Pac. Rly. Co. regarding t he Albion crossing was read and to be referred to Coun. Lathi when he returns.

A letter from the M.R. Fire Dept. requesting that the Fire Hydrants be painted and the brush cleared from around them was read and it was decided to have S.Berto do this in connection with his work in looking after the waterworks. The dept. also asked for some chairs and the Clerk was instructed to purchase a dozen.

A petition from J.W. Hutchison and others for improvements to the north end of 8th. Ave. and 38th. Road was read and the Clerk was to request them to take this matter up with Pitt Meadows Council as the roads in question were inter-municipal.

A petition from D. Hemminger and others requesting a water supply along 22nd. Road east off 14th. Avenue was read and the Clerk to reply that nothing in this line could be contemplated until the main system had been laid as passed by bylow in 1946, when it could then receive consideration.

A plan of a foreshore lease of the B.C. Forest Products Co. Ltd. relating to the frontage of the unopened end of 2nd. Ave. was presented for approval, this was agreed to by the following motion.

- ed by Coun. Finnie and Langley: That the B.C. Forest Products Ltd. plan of a portion of the foreshore fronting on portions of D.L. 278/279, Gp.1, be approved. <u>CARRIED</u>
- ed by Coun, Bell & Langley: That the B.C. Electric pole plans K8800/5636, 5492, 5471, 5470, 5539 and 5469 be approved. CARRIED
- ed by Coun. Bell & Finnie: That Pursuant to the provisions of Bylaws No's 199"A" and 211"A" that the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to sign the agreement between the Corporation and the Maple Ridge Bus Service Ltd. and to attach the Corporate Seal thereto. <u>CARRIED</u>

The Police report for June was passed around the table. A estimate of timber required for the Kanaka Creek bridge 43

at Webster's Corners made up by the foreman was placed before the Council and the Clerk was to phone Mr. E.S. Jones asking for an inspection and approval.

A request by Mr. Lawrence, corner of Dew. Tk. and 11th. Avenue, for permission to keep 200 or 300 hens was read and referred to the Town Planning Commission for approval.

A request by P.K. Papow for the purchase of SE_4^1 of SW_4^1 Sec. 11, Twp. 12, was to be held over and referred to Coun. Lahti for report.

A report that the south Allouette River was nearly break-ing thro' the river bank just above the 8th. Ave. bridge was referred to Coun. Brown to investigate and report.

The Reeve reported that he had received donations amounting to \$700.00 from P. Bain Lumber Mills Ltd. toward road upkeep and expected a further \$300.00 in the latter part of the year. The Clerk was to mail a letter of appreciation to Mr. Bain.

Coun. Finnie reported that there was considerable kicking by the licenced operators of trucks within the Municipality about certain ones not having taken out any Municipal Licence nor any Highway Licence and he was of the opinion that they should be prosecuted. He mentioned the following operating without licences, F.R. Street, 2trucks; Regal Lumber Supply, 2 trucks; Port Coquitiam Transfer, 3 trucks. The Clerk was in-structed to send accounts covering these and to notify the Public Utilities Highway Branch regarding the Highway Licenses.

Couh. Bell reported that the Council members had inspected 27th. Ave. north after the last Council members had inspect Miller had informed them that he would grade the road if the Council would put in a culvert and make the fill, this was figured at approx. \$300.00, it was decided by the Council that there were no funds left in the 1947 account to do this work. Coun. Bell would so inform Mr. Miller.

The Meeting adjourned at 10:40 p.m.



The tenders were set remarkably low but in face of the present market it was advisable to accept the highest offer and the following motion was passed:

Fairweather and Davison: That the offer of McMahon & Burns Ltd. for the purchase of \$51,000.00 of Maple Ridge Waterworks Debentures 3% due 1962 to 1966 inclusive at a price of \$92.55 plus accrued interest be accepted and that the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to surrender the said bonds on payment at the price offered.

CARRIED

The School Board Estimates were now dealt with and in this connection, the school Board was represented by Chairman C.S. Pallot and Trustees King and Bailey and Secretary W.C. Mundell. Minutes of March 11th, 1948

A special meeting of the Maple Ridge Council was held in the Municipal Hall, Haney, B. C. on Thursday, March 11th, 1948 at 8 p.m. Present the Reeve and full Council.

Mr. Willowby a representative of the Portland Cement people spoke to the Council in connection with an idea of building soil cement roads. He stated that this could be built at a cost of 80¢ per square fard with a depth of six inches. The Council said that they were interested and they were invited by Mr. Willowby to be taken down to Bellingham and shown the airport down there any time that they would like to.

Messrs. Adair and Allan, representing the Board of Trade spoke to the Council in regard to their request for a monetary contribution for 1948 and also their idea of having the Provincial government hardsurface the full width of the Lougheed Highway through Haney - asking for the necessary retaining walls and installing of storm - sewars. The Council were in sympathy with the delegation and would consider the grant later on and the Reeve pointed out that he also was working on the Provincial officials for the matters referred to on the Lougheed Highway.

Messrs A.K.Feltis, PlF.Trout, H.Leggett and Jack Tuck were interviewed in connection with their applications for the position of Assistant Tax Collector. Mr. Bouschard had been interviewed at the last meeting. On consideration Mr. Bouschard was engaged by the following motion:

Moved by Coun. Davison and Finnie: That Mr. Bouschard be engaged as Assistant Collector for 1948 on a 20% commission basis.

Minutes of March 11th, 1948 - continued

Peter Bell was present at the request of Councillor Brown and outlined to the Council the cost of a rock crushing plant which he and his partner were installing in a pit of their own near Deroche. He figured that a similar plant could be installed in our pit at a price of approximately \$6000.00. The Reeve decided to investigate some of the machine companies in Vancouver on Monday, March 15th and any Councillors destring to go with him could do so.

Mr. Menzies spoke to the Council asking them far if they had any proposal regarding the fixing of 25th Ave North from 27th Road. - Moved by Coun. Brown and Finnie: That the urgent request of delegation from old Spencer farm asking for prompt action in connection with the culvert on Lougheed be referred to the Provincial Government with urgent request for attention.

CARRIED

- Mr. Dall reported to the Council on the progress of public works, and that the shovel was now working in the Ruskin pit. He also spoke of the difficulty of transportation and it was decided that a ton and a half dual tire truck be purchased and in the meantime Mr. Dall be paid 10¢ per mile for the use of his own vehicle.
- Moved by: Coun. Finnie and Fairweather: That the Municipality purchase a new $l_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ ton truck of some kind for odd jobs and that Mr. Dall be paid log per mile for the use of his own pick up for thetime being on the Municipality business.

CARRIED

Mr. Dall also reported on the difficulty of obtaining the necessary supplies and machinery to instal the waterworks. In this connection the Reeve reported that he had ordered **thus** a shovel for the sewer work and expected that it would be in operation about the middle of next week. This should relieve the shovel in a short time for the waterworks.

Mr. Luko was present and spoke to the Council regarding the retaining wall on their property on the Lougheed Highway and stated that he would be willing to sign a petition under the local improvement as soon as he was able to find out the cost.

Minutes of June 29th, 1948

A special meeting of the Maple Ridge Council was held in the Municipal Hall, Haney, B. C. on Tuesday June 29th, 1948 at 8. p.m. Present the Reeve and full Council.

Mr. Burton, Mr Gee and others were in in support of a petition regarding water service on 14th Ave South. They stated that the water had come a half a mile south from the Dewdney Trunk Road and they wanted to know when it would be completed the rest of the way to serve their properties. They were advised that this would be completed just as soon as possible.

Mr. Burton also requested that the Council inspect the drainage from the road which runs from his property and which he claimed contaminated his well. This was to be inspected by Councillor Fairweather and Supervisor Mr. Dall.

Mr. J. Ellight asked permission to hook up with the sewer from Lot 4 to the west of his property. He washed lay the tile and obtain his own easement across lot 4. This was agreeable to the Council.

Mr. Eaton and others placed an offer to the Council to open up approximately 1000 feet of No. 8 Road between 21st and 25th Aves. They would blow the stumps and remove them with their don**key** and would pay one half of the cost of bulldozing, if the Council would supply the powder, pay one half the cost of bulldozing and do the necessary gravelling. This was agreeable on the face of it to the Council but the Reeve appointed Councillors Larson, Finnie, Davison and Fairweather as a committee with power to act and to obtain a surveyor if necessary.

Councillor Davison, Larson and Brown who had been appointed as a Flood Committee made a suggestion that Messrs Heselton, Addir, and Wright to be appointed as a rehabilitation housing committee to make personal investigations and reports in each case.

Mr. Stanyer spoke to the Council regarding the Blookage of the drain caused by an open mahhole on the road near his property and suggested that a proper cover would eliminate this trouble.

Moved by Coun. Brown and Finnie: That the manhole box next to Mr.Stanyers be taken care of right away.

CARRIED

Mr. E. Dunning on behalf of the Park Board requested permission from the Conncil to erect a shuffle board and horsesho e pit next to the swimming pool on the Civic Centre property. Permission was granted by the Council. Į.

A letter from Mr. Norman Whitsal requesting permission to erect a new approach and to erect a railing along the side of the road on the drop-off in fromt of his property in Whonock was read and permission granted.

A letter from the Haney Tractor Equipment quoting prices of mowers was read and on the report of the Cemetery Committee regarding the condition of the mower, it was decided that Councillor Finnie and Fairweather be a committee to purchase a new power lawn mower.

Mr. Barney Byrnes of Whonock was the only party replying to the advertisement regarding roadside mowing. His price was \$4.00 per hour.

Moved by Coun. Fairweather and Finnie: That Mr Byrnes be employed to cut grass and brush on all Municipal Roads under the direction of the works Supervisor.

A report on the condition of 25th Ave was made and it was decided that the Reeve and Councillors Finnie and Davison would check this report on Tuesday at 8 p.m.

Mr Burton on 14th Ave South asked for a report of the drainage problem on his place. Councillor Fairweather stated that he and Mr. Dall had examined this and as it was a natural water course with a well alongside the drain and in a depression that nothing could be done about it. Mr. Burton also spoke in connection with water service and Councillor Fairweather stated that he would Exists examine the proposition and report backto the Council.

Mr. White resubmitted his plan of subdivision at the corner of 10th Ave and Dewdney Trunk Road, but the Council stated that they could not change their opinion regarding the necessity of a 20 ft. lane.

The Reeve raised the point as to whether the Municipality would be willing to dispose of any of our crushed rock to the Columbia Bitulithic Co. This was agreed to at a price of \$1.25 per yd, but Mr. Dal was to obtain from the Company the amount required and it would be left in the Reeve to decide if the quantity were not to great.

The Clerk was to again redraw to the attention of Mr Dall the necessity of maximizing opening the ditch on 2nd Ave between the Lougheed Highway and McKenny Road.

It was decided that Mr. W. Dall was to supply some second hand planks to Mr. Rempel on 27th Ave and Mr. Bremno on No. 9 Road for repairs to their culverts.

Councillor Larson reported for the Committee in regard to his negotiation with Mr. Eaton in puting in part of the road on No. 8 Road. The committee also agreed to allow \$90.00 towards one days use of the bulldozer and \$40.00 towards plasting powder. Accounts to be put on certification of Mr. Dall.

Councillor Davison asked for an investigation of the Ditch on No. 54 Road and it was suggested that he and Mr. Dall make this investigation.

A discussion was raised by the Clerk regarding assistance in the hall and it was agreed that he should call for applications for this position.

A letter from Mr. Housser regarding the Pacific Stages was read and his suggestion was agreed to. ShQ Minutes of August 4th, 1948 - continued

A letter from the Public Utilities Commission notifying that a hearing on the change of the Pacific Stage route from Haney to Mission was read and the Reeve to attend.

A letter from the Albion Flood Control Association was read in regard to bank errosion.

Moved by Coun. Brown and Larson: That the resolution from the Albion Flood Control Association be forwarded to the Federal member, Mr. Cruikshank and the other authorities concerned with the recommendation that their request for a survey be granted. CARRIED

> A letter from the Vancouver General Hospital regarding clinical treatment for Mr. Albert Stuart was read and approved but another one for Roberta Ratcliffe was read but not approved.

A petition from R. S. Webb and others for the opening of 27th Road between 10th and 14th Ave was read and the Clerk to reply that there were no funds for this work for 1948.

A petition signed by Mr. J. Ling and many others, petitioning that angle parking be allowed on the South side of the Lougheed Highway from 7th to 9th Aves. was read and approved by the following resolution:

Moved by Coun. Davison and Brown: That angle parking be adopted on the south side of Lougheed Highway between 7th and 9th Aves and that lines be installed to cover same. Also that one hour parking be adopted between 7th and 9th Aves.

Moved by Coun. Brown and Larson: That the Building Inspector be authorized to pass no corrode pipe for use as sewer pipe on private property during the present shortage of vitrified.

CARRIED

A report by the Assistant Ranger That Mr. Papeau had been caught burning brush without a permit was read and he be warned that prosecution would follow if this happened again.

Mr. Dall gave an estimate of \$488.00 as the cost of renewing the bridge on the River Road at the junction of Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows. The Clerk to supply Pitt Meadows with a copy of this estimate and ask for their remarks.

Mr. Dall also submitted an estimate of the laying of 2640 feet of water main on 22nd Road at a cost of \$2904.00 and as there were only 12 customers on this line it wad considered excessive.

The Clerk reported that the Government officials claimed that if the retaining walls were put in now they could not install the curbs until sometime next year.

The meeting adjourned at 10:45 p.m.

Minutes of August 7th, 1948

The regular meeting of the Maple Ridge Council was held in the Municipal Hall, Haney, B. C. on Saturday August 7th, 1948 at 9:30 a.m. Present the Reeve and full Council.

Moved by Coun. Larson and Davison: That the minutes of July 4th, 21st and August 2nd be approved.

CARRIED

Councillor Fairweather gave a report on his investigation of a water line to Lindblad and Purdey. It would entail 2200 feet of one inch pipe added to the 1000 odd feet that is at present installed and it was considered that very little watter would be available at the end of this line. The jet Automia would cost about \$175.00 and it was suggested that Councillors Fairweather and Davison would interview the Pitt Meadows Council with the view of seeing if these people could obtain water from the Pitt Meadows system.

Two complaints were made regarding the condition of the Martyn Road off 8th Ave and the Foreman was instructed to have some gravel put on.

Councillor Fairweather also reported on his investigation of a water line to supply Mr. Burton on 14th Ave South. The Road required gravelling, clearing and the water line would have to be done by hand labour. A committee was authorized to see Mr. Burton if he would take on the contract of doing the required work.

Messrs Pallot, Bailey and Blair from the School Board were present and requested the allocation of \$2500 from the repair fund and \$2200 from the contingent fund toward capital construction of two new classrooms to the Haney Central School. This was agreed to by the following motion:

Moved by Coun. Fairweather and Davison: That the School Board be granted permission to re-allocate the sum of \$2300.00 of reconversion funds and \$2200.00 from the contingent fund for a permanant building project of two new class room additions to the Central School.

CARRIED

A delegation from Whonock spoke in regard to the necessary road repairs sothat the school busses could operate thereon. The roads mentioned were No' 2, 3, and 6 Roads and the Reeve stated that if necessary, after investigation, the Council would do what they could as soon as possible and the Foreman and Councillors Larson and Fairweather were to investigate this and make a report.

Mr. English reported to the Council that the Circle "D" Ranch was puting logs and stumps on No. 27 Road west of 25th Ave. Mr. Dall to investigate.

Mr. Herfort reported that in his opinion the necessary work had been done on the old A. & L. Right of Way through Sec.16. Mr. Dall was to investigate and report.

Mr. Olson requested that the road to his property be graded and some gravel placed thereon. The Reeve stated that the grader was to grade the road and that some gravel, if needed was to be placed as required.

Mr. Dall presented a recommendation covering the various wages of the employees of the Municipality. This was agreed to by the following motion:

Mr. Nicols, ltwing on the old Bowering place spoke to the Council in regard to the water. He was asked to try and contact someone to contract the digging and laying of the pipe and to report to the hall.

Mr. Clappison requested some mulch to fill the holes on 8th Ave in front of his place. This was agreeable to the Council, weather permitting.

Mr. Hardwell and Mr. Hécocks were both present in connection with the cribbing along the North Alouette River at the corner of 8th Ave and 32nd Rd. After some discussion it was agreed that if the two gentlemen in question were to put in piling and cribbing that the Municipality would supply imm a certain number of loads of rock.

Moved by Coun. Brown and Finnie: That Mr. Heacocks be given ten loads of boulders and Mr. Hardwell be given ten loads of same for use on banks of North Alouette.

CARRIED

The Reeve gave a lengthy report on the Public Utilities hearing in connection with the B. C. Motor Transportation and Maple Ridge Bus Service Ltd. and in particular he drew attention to a letter that had been written by the Maple Ridge Board of Trade which was being usedby the B. C. Motor Transportation Ltd to strengthen their case and in this connection the following motion was passed which was to be referred to the Maple Ridge Board of Trade.

Moved by Coun. Brown and Larson: That whereas the Council is endeavouring to protect the Maple Ridge Bus Service from encroachment by the Pacific Stages owing to the valuable and reasonably priced service that the former has been rendering to the District, the said service having contributed greatly to the convenience of the people and the expansion of the District and whereas the Pacific stages are using a letter written in April to the Fraser Valley Bus Lines by the Maple Ridge Board of Trade inquiring as to the reason for the suspension of service as an argument and exhibit in connection with their case. Therefore be it resolved that the Maple Ridge Board of Trade be asked to write the Public Utilities Commission clearly expressing their wishes in connection with the matter.

CARRIED

The Maple Ridge Park Board headed by E. Dunning refered to the Council a proposition to acquire 18 acres of land from L.S. Carr and K.J. Baker at a price of \$21,500. A letter from P. Bain Lumber Mills requesting repairs to the River Road at Whonock was read and to be referred to the foreman for attention.

A letter from Dr. Morse regarding the placing of Peter Sorenson a T.B. patient in some institution was read and to be refered back to the doctor in his capacity of Medical Health Officer for his attention.

A letter from the Maple Ridge School District No. 42 was read requesting the opening of No. 6 Road for school bus travel. The Chairman of the Board being present he was requested to refer this road to the traffic Officer, Constable McDonald for attention before anything further could be done on the matter.

A letter from W.J. Barnes requesting the opening of No. 27 Toad East of 11th Ave was read and the Clerk to reply that it was not likely that this work could be done in 1948.

Mr. G. McMartin was present in connection with the hooking up of his new hotel to the Haney Sewer system. It was decided that the Foreman should make a report on the sewer facilities and also the possibility of taking in residents of the Carr subdivision.

The Foreman reported that in his opinion a cedar culvert should be put in at Albion United Church. This was O:K'd.

The Foreman reported that the entrance of Mr Halls property off 28th Ave was in need of repair and the Reeve suggested that he and Councillor Larson investigate further and make another report.

Councillor Finnie stated that too many people were using stove pipes for chimneys and that this should be remedied.

Moved by Coun. Finnie and Davison: That the Inspector be informed that all stove pipes be condemned and chimneys be build.

Mr. Hawkins of 17th Ave spoke to the Council for a minute or two on the proposed money bylaws. One point he stressed was why had not the hydrant which was paid for quite a few months ago been erected. The Clerk was to investigate this.

The regular meeting of the Maple Ridge Council was held in the Municipal Hall, Haney, B. C. on Saturday November 6th, 1948 at 9:30 a.m. Present the Reeve and full Council. Councillor Brown arriving late.

John Way presented a proposed subdivision plan of his property on the corner of 33rd Ave and Dewdney Trunk Rd. This was to be investigated by Councillor Larson before approval.

Benner Bros. were granted permission to have their trucks load gravel if the said gravel was to be used on the Municipal roads.

Mr. Albert spoke about the condition of 32nd Ave bridge and the repairs required to certain roads.

The Reeve appointed Councillors Larson, Fairweather and Brown to examine 31st, 32nd and 33rd Ave's and No's 9 and 14 Roads, and to bring in a report. He also appointed Councillors Fairweather, Larson and Brown as a committee to bring in a report on the condition of No's 27 and 30th Roads.

Mr. Boudon spoke to the Council regarding the condition of the bridge on 22nd Road near his property. This was to be investitaged by the committee if possible.

Mr. Herfort was present at the request of the Council and to find out exactly what was required by the residents in the matter of fixing the old A. & L. Right of Way before the Council would dedicate it a Highway. A letter from the Assistant District Engineer of the Jublic Works Department outlining a cess-pool nuisance on the Lougheed Highway just East of 3rd Avenue was read and to be referred to the Sanitary Inspector for investigation.

A letter from the National Machinery Co. giving a quotation on a diesel motor was read and ordered filed.

A letter from the Photographic Sarvey Ltd. in connection with aerial photography and contour maps f the corporation was read and ordered filed.

The question of buldozing a portion of No. 14 Road just off 30th Ave was reported on by Councillor Larson with the request that the Supervisor consider this matter and possibly a little widening in various places would eliminate cutting down some of the hills.

The question of obtaining a site for the pump house at the corner of 17th Ave and Dewdney Trunk Road was left in the hands of the Clerk and Supervisor.

The Clerk was to advise Mr. C.W. McPherson that he would be charged 13¢ a front foot facing on Waugh St. and that the Municipal Crew would open and lay the pipe across Westfield Street if he decided to make the fill across to his property.

Mr. W. G. Friffins application for water was placed before the Council as he had requested a meter rather than to be placed on a fixed rate. The Council decided that as others had not been allowed to have meters that he be charged a flat rate of \$2.50 for his cafe and \$1.00 for each living quarters.

Councillor Clappison and Councillor Brown wanted a letter written to the B. C. Telephone Co. requesting that their poles on 8th Ave be replaced in a straight line in accordance with the new road allowance.

Moved by Coun. Brown and Clappison: That a letter be written to the Chief Engineer of B. C. Telephone asking the Co. to line up the pole line on 8th Ave between Dewdney Trunk and Lougheed in accordance with new alignment.

The Clerk was instructed to send a letter to Mr. Smith owner of the bowling alley in connection with the drainage water from his property coming out to 8th Ave and then on to the Campbell property asking that this be revoved.

The Clerk was instructed to write the Agricultural Association requesting them to remove the unsightly buildings erected on the old agriculture grounds.

Mr. Dall reported that he had not completed the inspection of 32nd Ave bridge but that he had inspected the drainage on the landeback of Fuller-Watson but due to the dumping of cinders and it was difficult to advise would should be done.

Councillor Brown arranged to drop in and see Fuller-Watson in this connection.

The meeting adjourned at 10:05 p.m.

In the meantime the foreman was to put some gravel on the hill.

Mr. Knapp of the forestry division of the University of B. C. was present and discussion took place regarding the proposed cut-off of the 14th Ave hill. Mr. Knapp reported that his department did not have any funds to spare this year. He also drew the attention of the Council that 14th Ave could not be abandaned all together and would be required to be kept in shape and for their purposes if a partial widening was made he felt that it would be satisfactory. He was very much in favour of the cut-off as according to plans which they had on hand a new grade would be approximately 5 to 6% but he figured that it would cost them from \$4000 to \$5000 to continue the road from the top in through the park to meet 14th Ave. The Council agreed with him but nothing definite was decided on regarding the road through Mr. Sinoski's property.

Councillor Brown reported **inst** the cemetery committee that Mr. Stewart had offered to cut all the trees on the new portion of the Maple Ridge Cemetery and would take them away for the sum of \$100 leaving only the stumbs to be handled by a bulldozer or some similar instrument.

It was agreed that Councillor J.^D. ^Brown be the representative of the Council to welcome Premier Douglas of Saskatchewan on Saturday June 4th 1949. The meeting adjourned at 10**9**39 p.m.

Minutes of June 4th, 1949

The regular meeting of the Maple Ridge Council was held in the Municipal Hall, Haney, B. C. onSaturday June 4th, 1949 at 9:30 a.m. Present the Reeve and full Council.

Moved by Coun. Larson and Brown: That the minutes of May 7th, 9th, 12th and 26th be adopted.

CARRIED

Representatives of the Columbia Bitulithic Co. were present and after some discussion the following motion was passed:

Moved by Coun. Fairweather and Davison: That the Columbia Bitulithic Co. Ltd. be authorized to prepare the base work on the Dewdney Trunk Road 73B from Lougheed Highway to Websters Corners on the basis of their letter of April 14th, 1949 on a cost plus 20% basis, work to start immediately, cost not to exceed \$3000.00.

CARRIED

Mr. Dragan spoke to the Council regarding the opening to the Dewdney Trunk Road of the old A. and L. right of way. He was advised that the Council had this under consideration.

Mr. Straker and a considerable number of others, representing the mink raisers of Maple Ridge were present, asking the Council to pass a bylaw to prevent blasting during whelping season:

Moved by Coun. Brown and Clappison: That the Clerk be instructed to inquire from the Provincial Authorities and Surrey Municipality as to what can be done to protect fur and chicken ranchers during whelping season.

CARRIED

A delegation headed by Mr. Lindblad of River Read, Hammond spoke to the Council regarding water service. As they were mainly from Pitt Meadows the Council suggested that they meet the Pitt Meadows Council in this regard and if Mr. Lindblad could get water from Pitt Meadows it would be alright with them.

A delegation was present in connection with the Gilker Road Hill. They were advised that Mr. Blois was not in favour of granting a right of way through his property at any price and the only thing the Council could do was to expropriate it under arbitration proceedings and only then if the owners were prepared to grade, gravel and ditbhthe new road at their own expense. The Clerk was to look into the matter regarding authority and to prepare a petition for the owners to sign.

Mrs. Hume living on the Dewdney Trunk Road east of the water tower requested a water extension to give them service. She was advised that this was not practicel at the present time but that if she could get water from Mielty's it would be alright as far as the Council was concerned.

A discussion took place regarding a letter from the residents of Hammond asking for the opening of Swede Park. Nothing definite was decided on the matter.

Minutes of June 4th, 1949- continued

Councillor Fairweather reported that the Residents of Ospring St. were being supplied with water from a $\frac{3}{4}$ inch pipe and recommended that a 3 inch pipe line be installed in its place.

Moved by Coun. Davison and Fairweather: That a 3 inch pipe water line be installed along Ospring Street, Hammond to replace present $\frac{3}{4}$ inch pipe.

CARRIED

Councillor Fairweather also reported that at the present time it was practically impossible to extend West End Ave to the River Road due to the bog and asked that the engineer give water levels to see if it would be drained.

Moved by Coun. Fairweather and Brown: That Mr. Hunter be asked to take water levels on the West End subdivision leading to River Road, and to show the Council how to best drain the bog existing at present.

CARRIED

Moved by Coun. Fairweather and Davison: That we approach the Provincial Public Works Dept. and ask them to hardsurface along Crescent Ave Hammond between the hardsurfacing of the Road-bed and the sidewalk The amount of surfacing required approximate 3510 sq.ft.. Hammond Hotel to the Post Office.

The Clerk was instructed to have the formman give Mr. Carl Olson also of Hammond one load of gravel.

Mr. H. Elassen spoke in connection with a ten foot strip which he had donated as a road allowance and also a 10 foot strip which had been donated by Parussinits. The Council advised Mr. Klassen that the road crew had received orders in 1948 to remove and replace the fence belonging to Parussini and that this would be looked into at once.

Mr. J.^L. Thompson presented a tentative plan of subdivision of his property which he was advised would be accepted on production of a proper plan.

Mr. Semkiw and others residing on 16th Road at the end of 18th Ave was wanted water service and this was referred to Councillor Davison for investigation and report.

Mr. Keil of Cloverdale spoke to the Council regarding setting up of seats at bus passenger stops throughout the Municipality. He was willing to pay at the rate of \$1.00 for each seat if granted the right to erect them. His provision being that they would pay for themselves through advertisements and the Council was to give this consideration.

Mr. A. Zirk on Lorne Road wanted an extension of the water pipe to his prepertyxexx2ndxAxe second house. This was referred to the water committee for inspection and report.

Mr. Schiller stated that the Dyking Commission was working on the dyke at the end of 8th Ave and had lowered the grade of the road and it was decided by the Council that a committee consisting of Councillors Fairweather, Clappison, Brown and Davison would review this on Monday night.

Mrs. Turner spoke regarding the Gilker road hill and the Reeve stated that the Council had agreed verbally to expropriate the land from Mr. Blois if she and the other parties concerned would grade and gravel the road when opened and the matter was left as such until the required money **kma** which was estimated at a minimum cost of \$750.00 would be put up.

Mr. Arthur Hawkins complained regarding the general loan rate and also the water sprinkling charge. These were explained to him.

The Clerk reported that he had been unable to find any Municipality who had a blasting bylaw in regard to the protection of mink and he was to reply to the Mink Breeders that the Council **did** not see theirs way to passing such a bylaw at the present time.

Councillor Larson reported that the roads in ward five were not obtaining their proper share of the use of the grader. He and Councillor Brown wanted a Public Works Committee appointed. They wanted to put a motion which the Reeve ruled out of order. After a considerable discussion the Reeve appointed Councillors Davison and Clappison as a public Works Committee.

Councillor Davison reported on the drainage on 10th Ave and stated that they had ordered this opened southward to the Lougheed Highway.

Considerablediscussion took place regarding the gravelling being done by the Municipal Crew without authority. This was going to be questioned to find out who was responsible.

A letter from the Maple Ridge Board of Trade regarding extra lighting on the Lougheed Highway and 8th Ave was read and the Clerk to reply asking them to present a petition but first to advise the petitioners of the additional cost and what it would be.

A letter from the Commissioner of B. C. Police advising that the 1950 contract had been drawn up on the basis of four men and the total contract figure for 1950 set at \$13,872.54. It was suggested that the Reeve interview Mr. Shirras, the Commissioner on the question while in Victoria.
