





15,000 individual items – around 400 too big for boxes with 150 very large/heavy items

Archival collection:

13,700 indexed and scanned photographs and at least 250,000 negatives with no scans or prints.

200 document collections [archives fonds] with 3,500 folders.

140 large folders of oversized plans and maps

95 very large maps rolled and stored

Gazette newspapers - 1923 to 1980

Maple Ridge Pitt Meadows Times - film-based images 1985 to roughly 2002.

Maple Ridge City Archives collection:

The collection consists of materials dating back to the 1874 incorporation of the District of Maple Ridge. The current inventory project is nearly complete.

Maple Ridge Museum and Community Archives continues to serve the community...


