Pay Your 2020 Property Taxes By September 30

Your 2020 Property Tax Notice will arrive in the mail over the next week. If you do not receive it by June 12, 2020, contact us or download it online at mycity.mapleridge. ca; please see *mapleridge.ca/2235* for more information about MyCity, and contact us if you need any help setting up your account.

Your Council recognizes that the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted household finances, and they have provided extra time to allow property owners to stabilize their financial situation. The due date is still July 2, 2020 and if you are able, we ask that you pay your taxes by then. But if you need extra time, you have until September 30, 2020 to

pay before the late penalty is applied on October 1, 2020. Don't forget to claim your Home Owner Grant (if eligible); it only takes a few minutes online at *hog.mapleridge.ca* or send us your application on the property tax notice. Please take a moment to review both sides of your Property Tax Notice for important information on deadlines, payment options, the Provincial Tax Deferment Program and the popular Pre-Authorized Withdrawal Service. 

Total Municipal Taxes

These are the funds collected to pay for the operation of the City of Maple Ridge. They include:

- General, Debt & Library
- Drainage Improvements Levy
 Parks & Recreation Improvement Levy
- Parcel Charges

The City also collects for Utility Services that include the Water Levy, the Sewer Levy and the Blue Box recycling program. A significant portion of the Water and Sewer Levy funds the City collects goes to Metro Vancouver to fund the infrastructure to deliver those services
