The City of Maple Ridge has launched a new Virtual Online Assistant or 'ChatBot.' This clever little Artificial Intelligence tool is a digital relative of the 'Beast' that sits outside City Hall. As part of the launch of this new website tool, we are having a contest to find a name for the ChatBot.

The Bot notesin the launch ad located in this edition of The News, "Can you please give me a name? The humans have gone out and bought \$300 in gift cards from local businesses for the human that comes up with the best name. You can suggest a name using my interface by using the prompt 'I want to give you a name' or you can send your suggestions for my name to the email 'communications@

mapleridge.ca' and my human handlers will shortlist the top five names and bring that list to Council, who will make the final choice."

The Bot continues, "I may be a young virtual office assistant, but my time on the internet has taught me that I don't want to be called 'Beasty McBeastface" or "HAL 2020" (I would have totally opened the pod bay doors for Dave). Step up your naming game humans."

### **Annual Report & Citizens Report Released Online**



We're pleased to announce that two important publications, the City of Maple Ridge Annual Report and Citizens Report, both for the year ending December 31, 2019, have been completed and loaded to the City website.

The Annual Report, along with the 'Statement of Financial information' was presented to Council as part of the July 21, 2020, Committee of the Whole meeting. The Annual Report contains the audited Financial Statements for the City of Maple Ridge as well as key information and comparative statistics to help our citizens

better understand the operations of their City government. The City has been recognized by the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) for nearly three decades for the quality of this information.

The Citizens Report compiles key information from the Annual Report into a magazine style publication that's more accessible for citizens who don't want to do a deep dive into the financial data, but do want to learn more about the City's work highlights, annual activities and fiscal health. This award winning publication is like the City's yearbook, looking back on 2019 with a combination of articles, charts and photos.
