9.4 Kilometres of Maple Ridge's Road Network Scheduled for Repaving in 2018

Maple Ridge, BC: Council has approved the 2018 Pavement Rehabilitation Program consisting of 14 projects that have been identified as the highest priority for repaving.

“Maple Ridge has approximately 500 kilometres of paved roads that we maintain. We use a number of methods to identify the priorities for our annual road rehabilitation program. We also look at planned underground infrastructure replacement by utility companies and private development that is planned as we schedule these projects to protect our investment in paving,” said Walter Oleschak, Superintendent of Roads & Fleet for the City of Maple Ridge.

The 14 projects identified for 2018 include;

1. Westfield Avenue: 207 Street to Maple Crescent
2. 102 Avenue: 240 Street to Jackson Road
3. 232 Street: Dewdney Trunk Road to 122 Avenue
4. 100 Avenue: 248 Street to 256 Street
5. Marshall Ave: 248 Street to 251 Street
6. 123 Avenue: 227 Street to 228 Street
7. 112 Avenue: 24300 Block to 246 Street
8. 246 Street: 112 Avenue to 113 Avenue
9. 208 Street: Powell Ave to 123 Street
10. Powell Avenue: 203 Street to 208 Street
11. 132 Avenue: 216 Street to 220 Street
12. West Street: Maple Meadows Way to 119A Avenue
13. 104 Avenue: 282 Street to 287 Street
14. 124 Avenue: 252 Street west to the end of the existing road

“In total this represents approximately 9.4 kilometres of roads or nearly 2% of the City’s road network,” said Mr. Oleschak. “We encourage citizens to sign up for construction alerts using the ‘Notify Me’ feature on the City website at mapleridge.ca. We appreciate the patience of citizens as we do this work over the next six months.”

Funding for this work comes from the City’s Infrastructure Reserve Fund, maintenance reserves, Development Cost Charges and contributions from TransLink for a total invest of \$18 million for 2018.
