Who is the neighbourhood of Haney named after?

**Thomas Haney:** A pioneer of Irish descent, Thomas Haney purchased 160 acres of land in this area for \$1000 in 1879. He and his wife, Anne, along with their six children were instrumental in Maple Ridge's history.

What was Thomas Haney's primary occupation?

**Brick maker**

Which Hudson's Bay company settlement did the earliest Maple Ridge pioneers come from?

**Fort Langley:** Built in 1827, Fort Langley was a Hudson's Bay Company fur trading post on the banks of the Fraser River.





What was the original name for 224th street in Maple Ridge?

**Ontario Street**

The city name "Maple Ridge" originally came from whose farm?

**John McIver:** John was a Scottish settler who came to Western Canada as a worker of the HBC company. He was based at Fort Langley for some time before purchasing property across the river in the Hammond area of (now) Maple Ridge. He named his property "Maple Ridge" because of the ridge of maple trees on this land.

Which two local families have been farming in Maple Ridge continuously for over 120 years?

The Hampton and Laity families: William Hampton and John Laity moved to British Columbia from Colorado in search of good land for farming in 1879.

Before 1912, Maple Ridge did not have its own community doctor. Where did the nearest doctor live?

**New Westminster:** Doctors in rural communities throughout Canada were very rare in the 19th, and even the early 20th, centuries. Prior to 1912, Maple Ridge area residents had to travel by train or horse to New Westminster or Vancouver to see a physician.





Who was the first practicing doctor in Maple Ridge?

**Dr. Garnet Morse:** In 1912, the first clinic of the area opened in Port Haney with Dr. Morse as the first physician of Maple Ridge. He would often travel great distances in a day to see patients, including to the Allco camp to treat the logging workers as needed.

**Sixth:** Maple Ridge was incorporated as a municipality on September 12, 1874. Only Victoria, New Westminster, Nanaimo, North Cowichan, and Chilliwack are older.





Who was Maple Ridge's longest serving mayor?

**Solomon Mussallem:** Originally immigrating to Canada from Lebanon in 1897, Mr. Mussallem lived in Winnipeg, Prince Rupert, and Vancouver before settling in Maple Ridge with his family in 1919 and opening the Haney Garage. He served 23 years in our municipal government, 21 of those years as Mayor. One of his sons, George, was also in politics and served four terms as a MLA.

How many people were killed by the Port Haney landslide of 1880?

**One:** In February 1880, a large part of the south bank of the Howison farm slid into the Fraser River. This event became known as the "Haney Slide" and created tsunamilike waves that caused a lot of damage to buildings along the river.





Which local historic church was originally in the Derby area of Langley, dismantled, and then floated across the river to be reassembled in Maple Ridge?

**St. John the Divine:** This church opened for its first service in Derby in 1859. But, with the construction of the railway bringing a surge of residents to Maple Ridge, it was decided to bring the church across the river. In 1882, a team of people dismantled the church and floated it across the river for reassembly on River Road. Today, St. John the Divine is the oldest church in the Lower Mainland of BC.

What ethnic group formed 30% of the Maple Ridge population in the 1920s and 1930s?

**Japanese:** Prior to the internment measures of WW2, the area of Maple Ridge was home to a thriving Japanese population. Most of these families were farmers, specializing in greenhouse techniques and berry farming.





The "Haney House" is now a museum, but it was the residence of the Haney family for a long time. How long did members of that family inhabit this house?

**96 years:** Thomas Haney, his wife Anne Callaghan, and their descendants built and inhabited this home from 1883 to 1979. For some time, it was referred to as the "Hawley House", as daughter Elizabeth married James Hawley in 1917. They moved into the home shortly after marriage and raised a family there. Elizabeth worked hard to have the home recognized as a heritage site and it was donated to the municipality of Maple Ridge in 1980.

Emily Carr (1871-1945)





How many artists were in the Group of Seven?

It grew to 10 members. It's part joke, part trick question as the Group of Seven eventually grew to 10 members. They disbanded and reformed as "The Canadian Group of Painters" in 1933, growing to more than two dozen artists, counting about one-third women among the membership this time)

The McMichael Collection in Kleinburg, Ontario is home to one of the largest Group of Seven collections in Canada. What else is located on the grounds of this Canadian gallery?

The remains of six of the Group of Seven are interred on the property.

Which Canadian sculptor has a massive jade green bronze work featured at Vancouver International Airport?

Haida artist, Bill Reid (1920-1988), The Spirit of Haida Gwaii: The Jade Canoe (1994). Originally created for the new Canadian embassy in Washington DC, it now welcomes visitors to the world.

Which famous East Coast Canadian folk artist sold her paintings from her front door, but never in her lifetime received more than \$10 per painting?

Maud Lewis (1903-1970) of Nova Scotia. A Maud Lewis painting recently fetched \$22,000 at auction. Lewis painted on everything; her entire house is restored and preserved in the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia (it is a small house).

Where is the earliest form of paintings found in Canada?

Grotto Canyon, Bow Valley Provincial Park, Alberta. The pictographs found on the smooth canyon walls are estimated to be between 500 and 1,300 years old.





Art for the Dogs – what fountain has 29 dogs and one cat?

Berczy Park fountain by Montreal landscape architect Claude Cormier. Located near the St. Lawrence Market behind the historic Gooderham Building on Front Street, the Berczy Park dog fountain features 27 dog sculptures, a giant golden bone, and a cat. Made from cast iron, the three-tier fountain is shaped like a collar and weighs 26,000 pounds. The redesigned fountain is part of a \$7.2 makeover of the park, which also includes benches and trees.
